Explanation:

There are 6 anterior teeth per arch (12 total). These include all 4 incisors and a pair of canines per arch.

Question: 3

Answer: E

Explanation:

Epinephrine must be at 0.1% or 0.8% concentrations when used as a vasoconstriction hemostatic agent on retraction cord. It is contraindicated for cardiac patients.

Answer: C

Explanation:

Foliate papillae are the only tastebuds found on the lateral surfaces of the tongue. They are ridge-shaped and are rudimentary and nonfunctional.
